VASQUEZ WINS OPENING OF THREE-CUSHION MATCH

In the first day's play of their 300-point match at three-cushion caroms, at "La Boite," Luis Vasquez, the Spanish champion who is meeting S. Johnson of New York, ran out his fifty points. While Johnson managed to gather in forty points, fifty points are to be played at each day's play of the match until the 300 are counted. It was the first time that the American had played in public in Mexico. He did excellent work, all things considered, and at stages showed flashes of form which indicates that the match will be hard-fought before the end of the six days' play. Johnson was not acquainted with the cushions, which are not as lively as might be asked, and they do not take the English as a first class table in fit condition for match play. The opening game is the style of play to which Johnson devotes himself exclusively, and he showed this by his readiness in going after shots, while Vasquez, who has been playing straight billiards and the balk line game, hesitated at times as to the best way in which to go about a shot. Johnson announced after the game that he stood ready to back himself for \$500 gold against Vasquez at the three-cushion game on an American table, with new, lively cushions. Once during the play he counted as the result of the cushions falling to take the English, and he remarked: "On a good table I never would have made that one." Johnson should play a faster game when he has become acquainted with the table, and there should be very little difference between the two men at the finish. Vasquez played good billiards, making a four as the high run of the game. He did not settle into his game

JALISCO CUP RACES WILL BE GREATLY IMPROVED

Special Dispatch to The Herald. Guadalajara, Oct. 26.—The money now in the treasury of the recently organized Mexican Automobile association amounts to about \$40,000, and this sum will be spent in improving the Jalisco automobile course so that it will be in excellent shape for races during Easter week next year. Four races are now scheduled, and the meet will extend over at least three days. It is confidently expected that next year's races will attract several thousand people to Guadalajara. The details of the next race meet, as now outlined by the new association, were brought to this city by Alfonso Fernandez Somellera, who returned to Guadalajara from Mexico City a few days ago. Mr. Somellera was almost entirely responsible for the automobile races held here last year, and was the principal promoter of the Mexican Automobile association. As stated last week, the association was organized in Mexico City with Governor Ahumada, of Jalisco, as president, and Andres Bermellillo, of Mexico City, as secretary and treasurer. The Guadalajara members of the provisional board of directors are Mr. Somellera, Julio Collignon and Jose Maria Gomez. The first race of next year's meet will be for the Jalisco cup and will be limited to racing machines weighing not to exceed 1,150 kilos. The second race, will be for touring cars of forty-five horsepower and more; the third race for touring cars of from thirty to forty-five horsepower, and the fourth race for touring cars under thirty-horsepower. Every touring car entered must have its tonneau on and be fully equipped, and in the race must carry four persons or their equivalent in weight. The tops of touring cars may be removed. For the race for the Jalisco cup it is expected that a number of racing machines from American and European factories will be entered, and that there will be several drivers of international reputation. OFF FOR GUANAJUATO

KID MITCHELL LEAVES ON MATCH-MAKING JAUNT.

Accompanied by Jack Stevens, one of the shrewdest sporting men in the city, Kid Mitchell left last night for Guanajuato, where he will attempt to make a match with Jim Smith, now under the management of Andrew Ennis of that city.

Ennis has issued a challenge on behalf of Smith to fight Mitchell at a finish with hard handgags, at 150 pounds ringside. Mitchell goes with the announced intention of not acceding to the demand for a finish battle nor to a weight condition of 150 pounds. He wants to fight the negro for twenty rounds to a decision at catch weights and declares that he can get backing that the negro will not stand before him twenty rounds if the backers of Smith will concede odds on the bet.

As forecasted in The Mexican Herald, Mitchell's manager was not able to go without an adviser and tried to get either Larry Martin or Jack Stevens to accompany him as a match-maker. Stevens finally consented and the pair left last night.

It is probable that the bout will be pulled off in Guanajuato if it is made, as the town is said to be fight crazy and any match which Ennis would make would be considered a big drawing card. Added to the fact that the opponent of Smith will be the champion of the republic and that Smith fought him twenty hard rounds on the occasion of their meeting here, the match would make a great attraction for the mining camp.

BUTLIN MEETS MACQUISTON

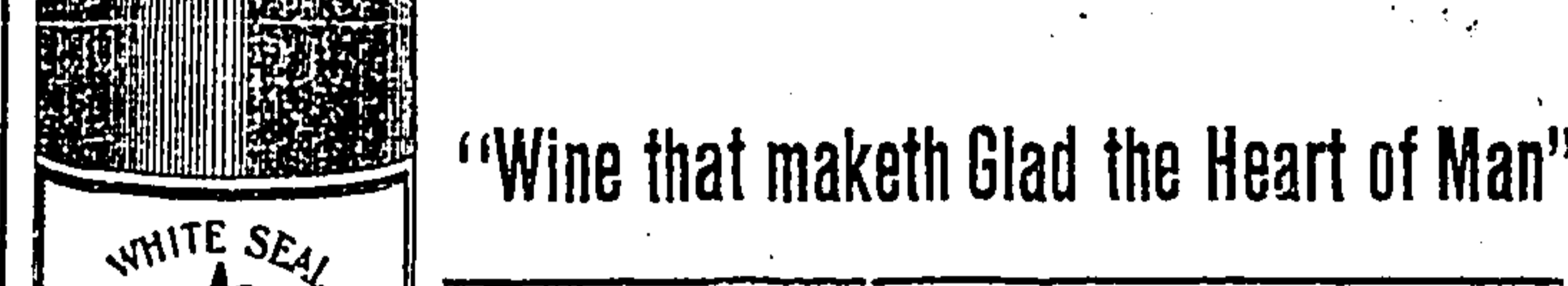
