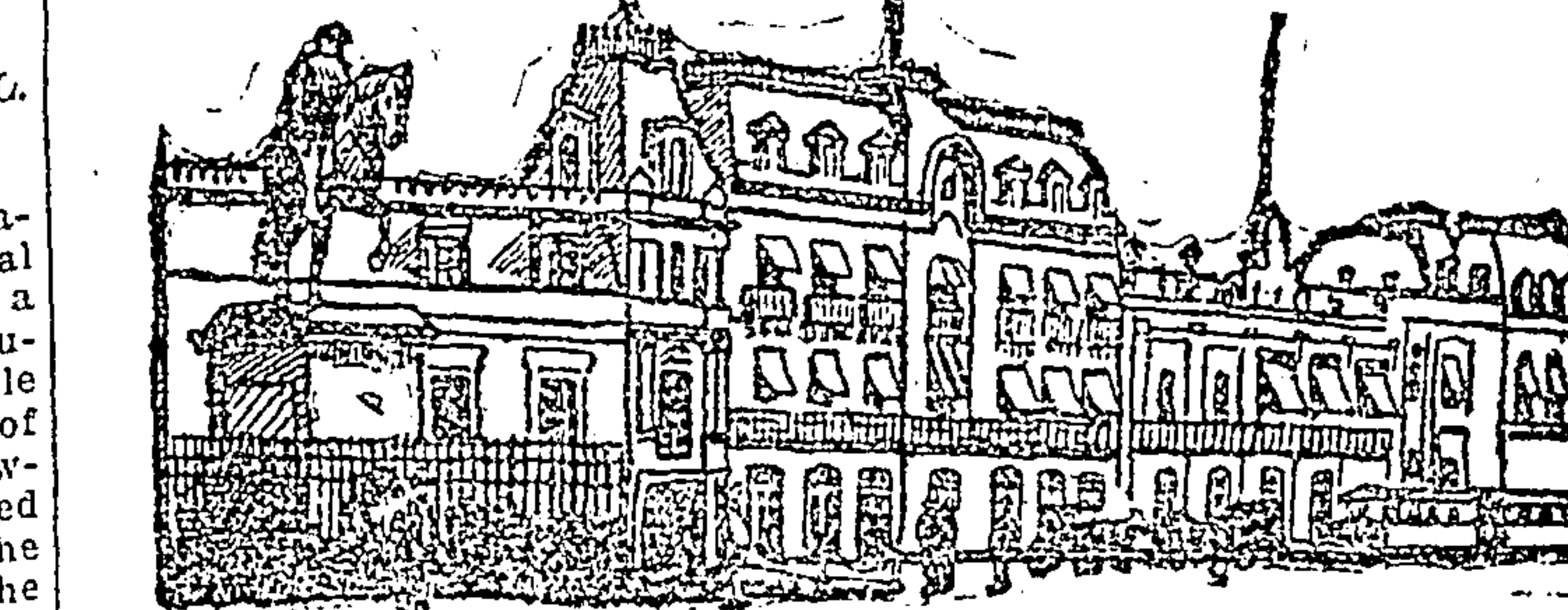
GOOD SHOWING MADE BY PUBLIC REGISTRY

Chihuahua, April 26.—During the year 1907 the public registry of the state showed a registration of 1,671 deeds or documents showing business transactions in the state to the total amount of \$9,677,080.84, upon which the fees were \$4,764.50. This is a remarkable showing compared with 1906, when the public registry showed only 795 documents filed, and the transactions so recorded, \$4,729,115.84.
